

Implementation and Health Care Improvement Masterclass

Managing Change for Direct Health Impact | 30 - 31 August 2018 The Alfred Campus

This two-day masterclass is aimed at health professionals, researchers, policy makers and front-line clinicians who seek guidance and inspiration on healthcare improvement. The masterclass will be facilitated by experts in the field who will guide participants seeking to initiate their own implementation projects and support those currently involved in healthcare improvement projects.

The course includes an overview of the Australian health services context, implementation science approaches, evidence synthesis, stakeholder engagement and co-design of implementation projects with service users.



Associate Professor Susannah Ahern *MBBS (Hons), MBA, FRACMA, PhD* is the Head of the Registry Sciences Unit, Course Co-ordinator of the Masters of Health Services Management and Academic Lead for the Australian Cystic Fibrosis Data Registry. Susannah's academic interests include clinical registry governance and scientific methods, health service clinical governance, medical workforce and training, and clinical services planning.



Dr. Prue Burns is a Research Fellow at Monash Business School for the Australian Research Council Linkage Project, *Towards the healthcare system of the future: The role of institutional entrepreneurship in service redesign and innovation*. The theme that unites her research interests is understanding how institutional change may be provoked and harnessed for the social good.
