

Implementation and Healthcare Improvement Masterclass

Managing Change for Direct Health Impact 3 - 4 July 2019, Monash Medical Centre, Clayton

This course will provide an overview of the Australian health services context, implementation science approaches, evidence synthesis, stakeholder engagement and co-design of implementation projects with service users.

This two-day masterclass is aimed at health professionals, researchers, policy makers and front-line clinicians who seek guidance and inspiration on healthcare improvement. The masterclass will be facilitated by experts in the field who will guide participants seeking to initiate their own implementation projects and support those currently involved in healthcare improvement projects.



Professor Danny Liew is the Chair of Clinical Outcomes Research, Head of the Division of Clinical Epidemiology and Director of the Centre of Cardiovascular Research and Education at Monash University's School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine. He is also a consultant physician at The Alfred Hospital in General Medicine and Clinical Pharmacology. Danny's research capacity and interests lie in epidemiology, clinical trials, health services research and health technology assessment.



Professor Helena Teede is a clinician and academic. She is an endocrinologist who is strongly committed to leading and driving evidence into practice to ensure improved health outcomes. She is the Director of Monash Centre for Health Research and Implementation, School of Public Health and is Executive Director of Monash Partners Academic Health Science Centre, sits on the NHMRC research committee and has had a range of leadership roles throughout her career.



Professor Helen Skouteris is the Monash Warwick Alliance Professor of Healthcare Improvement and Implementation Science at Monash University. She has a strong focus on partnership in research, education/training and translation for healthcare improvement, implementation science/health services research, working with colleagues from Monash University, Warwick University, Monash Partners and beyond. Her work has strongly engaged government and has transformed policy.



Associate Professor Susannah Ahern is the Head of the Registry Sciences Unit, Course Co-ordinator of the Masters of Health Services Management and Academic Lead for the Australian Cystic Fibrosis Data Registry. Susannah's academic interests include clinical registry governance and scientific methods, health service clinical governance, medical workforce and training, and clinical services planning.



Dr. Tracy Robinson has extensive experience at designing curriculum and professional development programs for the health workforce. She is an expert in implementation science and quality and safety programs. Tracy completed a postdoctoral fellowship in implementation science at the University of Sydney and currently leads the development of workforce and education programs at the Monash Centre for Health Research and Implementation (MCHRI).
